

Janice Griffith, of Apsley, is Deputy Reeve of the Township of North Kawartha and is a candidate for Reeve in elections in November 2003. Ms. Griffith is a member of the Government-appointed Local Stakeholder Committee for the Kawartha Highlands, whose unanimous recommendations were enshrined in the Kawartha Highlands Charter and legislation. She is also on the boards of the Greater Peterborough Area Economic Development Corporation and Peterborough Housing Corporation. Ms. Griffith spent 25 years in management with YMCA-YWCA and Participation Peterborough.
